Language Arts

- Recognition of 88 basic sight words
- Able to write complete sentences
- Know 1st grade level contractions
- Master weekly spelling list (80%)
- Master weekly phonics list (90%)
- Learn to form letters accurately
- Develop print awareness and letter recognition
- Learn to form letters spontaneously
- Able to use antonyms, synonyms, and homonyms with basic 1st grade words
- Complete 1st grade readers (levels 1-6) and can read with fluency, accuracy, and comprehension
- Begin sentences with capital letter and ends with appropriate mark
- Recognize and distinguish all digraphs, diphthongs, ghost letters, blends, combinations, and trigraphs



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Mathematics

- Master (90%) basic addition and subtraction facts (1-12s)
- Measure to nearest inch and centimeter
- Proficient (100%) in counting by 2s, 5s, 10s, even, and odd numbers (1-100)
- Can identify, know value of, and count in groups the coins penny, nickel, dime, and quarter
- Able to solve simple addition and subtraction story problems
- Able to tell time to the hour and half-hour
- Recognize and use the liquid measurements of cup, pint, half-gallon, liter, and gallon
- Add and subtract numbers up to the hundreds place without regrouping
- Master weekly mathematics assessments (80%)



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Bible

- Learn and enjoy singing hymns/song of thanksgiving/praise
- Become instilled with a love for Bible reading and memorization
- Make connections between biblical truths and practical living
- Understand God's sovereignty
- Learn that God's word is truth and that events retold are historical in nature
- Understand the Gospel message and be able to reiterate it to others
- Learn the Biblical answers to the Westminster Catechism questions regarding God and man
- Learn the attributes of God

Literature/Poetry

- Identify the main characters in the books read aloud during class
- Name the setting in which a story takes place
- Identify a simple plot with the main conflict noted
- Discuss the resolution achieved in a story
- Make predictions about story outcomes
- Develop good listening skills through having books read aloud in the classroom
- Develop and test comprehension skills through oral questioning and classroom work
- Memorize each poem accurately and be able to recite them in front of their peers.*

*Expression will be taught but is not required.



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History

- Identify the basic historical and foundational beginnings of our country
- Recall the historical basis and customs regarding major holidays (i.e. Thanksgiving, etc.)
- Participate in hands-on experiences with historical context (i.e. field trips, plays, etc.)
- Listen to important read-aloud biographies associated with historical holidays
- Identify the four major compass directions and use them on a map
- Identify and use a map key
- Demonstrate familiarity with the location and names of the 50 states of the USA
- Recall key facts about Kansas including state symbols, past citizens and historical information

Science

- Learn observation skills while gaining an appreciation for God's creation
- Learn the skill of inquiry about the world in which he/she lives
- Describe information being studied in a concise manner
- Learn to make accurate descriptions and comparisons during their studies
- Build on the skill of storing learning in math and integrate them during science
- Study foundational science concepts and integrate them in other subjects
- Learn, observe, and compare various life science topics including life cycles
- Learn how to conduct basic science experiments
