- Circle one elective for each period, each day.
- Teacher aiding/tutoring requires approval from the teacher and Mrs. Congdon. A student may only aide/tutor during 1 period per day. A teacher can only have 1 aide per period.
- Choir, Madrigals, Yearbook and Sophomore Rhetoric must be taken both semesters.
- Students who are interested in taking an elective course opposite choir may enroll in choir 2 days a week.
- “Senior Option” allows seniors (who have signed parental consent) to sign out Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, &/or Fridays at 2:45 pm & leave school for the day. Senior Option is granted to those who demonstrate justification through a written letter for approval by Mrs. Congdon. If a student chooses senior option for a particular day, they will not be allowed to take a study hall that day.
- Independent study (IS) is not listed in a time slot. All IS candidates must receive collaboration and approval from a proposed instructor. No instructor may have more than two IS classes per semester. No student may have more than 2 IS courses per semester. Students must have a minimum GPA of 3.0. IS applications must be submitted by June 1, 2018. Send to Cair Paravel c/o Mrs. Collins. Remember that student and faculty supervisor must sign proposal.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Mentoring

This elective is limited to **Juniors and Seniors** and requires approval by the Chief Administrator. Students will learn the basics of mentoring grammar school age students. This will include classroom instruction as well as actually mentoring a grammar school student.

CLEP Prep Course

The purpose of this course is for students to prepare for and take College Level Examination Placement tests. The CLEP tests allow students to earn college credit during the high school years.

Students will create a free account on the ModernStates.org website. They will then choose a free online course which will prepare them to take a College Level Examination Placement(CLEP) test. At the completion of the ModernStates.org online course, students will qualify for a voucher that can be used to cover the cost of the CLEP test. The online courses require 15-25 hours of work to complete the class. This course is open to **Juniors and Seniors with preference given to Seniors**. This course will run on a semester basis.

The Modern Novel

Beginning in the late 19th century, art took a turn away from Classical and Romantic ideals and turned to the philosophy and metaphysics of Modernism. This turning point greatly affected all literature which followed. In this class, we will be discussing the themes and literary artistry as well as the philosophical underpinnings that have influenced modern literature.

World Religions

World Religions will serve as an ideal introduction to the various religions found in African, Yogic, and Abramic traditions; Witchcraft, Sorcery, Zulu, Hinduism, Buddhism, Judaism, Christianity, and Islam. The class will provide basic information about various religious traditions and some of its manifestations in an engaging way. Students will grasp the complexity of religious life and recognize that engagement with an individual’s life and work brings with it the realization that religious beliefs are never as neat and clear-cut as they appear.

Anatomy/Physiology

This elective course is designed to study the human body in more detail. Students will study the human body systems and processes. This course is designed for students considering further study in biology, medicine or health care.

Prerequisites: The student must be in good standing in all academic areas. Student must have completed both Biology and Chemistry and **must be a Junior or Senior**. (Seniors will be given preference.)

All Things BBQ

This course is structured to teach the fundamental and basic concepts of BBQ-ing. To include cooking techniques, heat transfer, sanitation, safety, equipment usage, maintenance, meal planning, grocery list, and food prep for grilling and smoking. Due to the nature of this course, students must understand before signing up that every two students must own a charcoal grill and will pay for their meal costs. **This course will open to Freshmen and Sophomore FIRST.**

Life Skills

This course, offered once per week, will cover various “life skills” such as sewing a button on a shirt, changing a flat tire, basic cooking skills, etc. Various instructors will lead the course depending on the subject / material for that week.
